


Updates from Kathy

International Focus

In the United Kingdom, the <u>Leeds Older</u> <u>People's Forum</u> was established in March 1994 and has grown to a citywide membership of over 100 voluntary sector organizations

working with older people across the community. All member organizations provide services dedicated to older people though they are not necessarily an older people's organization.

The Leeds Older People's Forum aims to promote the well-being of all older people in the city of Leeds, and to give a more powerful voice to older people in shaping their city for the benefit of all its citizens. The Forum supports its members and ensures the voluntary sector is involved in planning, developing and managing services for older people in Leeds.

Celebrating Age-Friendly Sarasota

Seniors Advisory Council

The Seniors Advisory Council is a citizen advisory board to the Sarasota County Board of County Commission. Members provide a conduit for citizen input to the County Commissioners in making recommendations and/or providing advice on issues and conditions affecting Sarasota County's senior community.

The Council meets on the first Thursday of the month at the William L. Little Health and Human Services Center (2200 Ringling Blvd.) in Room 226 at 3:00 p.m. All meetings support government in the sunshine (as expressed in Florida's Sunshine Law), and are recorded and open to the public.

Currently, the Council is working on the Accessible and Affordable Transportation Priority to identify the barriers and missing resources of senior transportation within Sarasota County. For further information click here.
